- Professional Internship: a supervised internship is required of all majors and serves as the major capstone requirement. The internship is designed to create a bridge between theory and practical application. Students, working with their advisors and the internship coordinator, select an appropriate setting based on their professional and career interests. Students must register for an 8 credit (10-week, 400 hour) or 12 credit (14-week, 560 hour) internship that is under the supervision of a qualified professional. Specific requirements are identified in the *Internship Manual* available from the Department of Recreation Management and Policy.
- ² Other courses may be recommended by the academic advisor to fulfill the elective requirement.
- ³ RMP students enrolled in an accelerated masters program offered by the Carsey School of Public Policy may count any Carsey graduate course as an elective toward their undergraduate RMP degree.
